Beloved Friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our risen Lord, Jesus Christ! I hope you are doing well during this Lenten season. As we journey through this time, I pray for each of you a renewed spirit,



strengthened faith, and a deeper understanding of God's love in our lives.

As we progress through each day of Lent, our journey will culminate on Easter, April 20th. However, this is not the end of our journey, but the beginning of new life in Christ. Christ is alive, and we are an Easter people, not just on Easter Sunday, but every day of the year! The truth and reality of Christ's resurrection allow us to celebrate wherever we may be.

Easter teaches us that we are a people of resurrection. Through the darkness of Good Friday and the silence of Holy Saturday, we reach the dawn of new hope, new life, and new beginnings. The empty tomb is not merely a historical event; it is an eternal promise that God's love triumphs over death, that grace abounds despite our failures, and that hope shines even in the darkest valleys.

This Easter, we find ourselves in a world that is still yearning for healing and restoration. Many among us carry burdens of grief, uncertainty, and weariness. Yet, the resurrection of Jesus calls us to trust in the renewing power of God's

resurrection give you the courage to walk boldly in faith, trusting that the same power that raised Christ from the dead is at work within you.

P.S.: During the upcoming Holy Week, we will reflect on the Passion of Jesus Christ. Below is the schedule for our services:

- Passion/Palm Sunday, Sunday, April 13th, 9:30 am:
 Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to fulfill an ancient prophecy. Farmingdale UMC will present the Easter Cantata on this day.
- Maundy/Holy Thursday, April 17th, 7 pm: Jesus shared the Passover meal in the upper room, where the loaf of bread and cup of wine represented His body and blood, which would soon

be sacrificed and shed. Farmingdale UMC will present the play "Voices at the Table." After the play, we will have an opportunity to share communion at the table of Jesus.

- Good Friday, April 18^{th,} 7 pm: Jesus was nailed to the cross, freeing us from the guilt and sins that burden us. Farmingdale UMC will host the Good Friday Tenebrae service.
- Easter, Sunday, April 20th at 9:30 am: Women went to the tomb and discovered that the heavy stone sealing the entrance had been rolled away. Christ is risen! May the joy and hope of Easter, this wonderful Good News of new life, bring blessings to you and your family. Come and be refreshed in God's never-ending springs of comfort, abundance, and love.

Notes From the Loft



ROMANS 15:5-6 reads, "May our dependably steady and warmly personal God develop maturity in you so that you get along with each other as well as Jesus gets along with us all. Then we'll be a choir – not only our voices only. But our very lives singing in harmony in a stunning

anthem to the God and Father of our Master Jesus!"

(from THE MESSAGE)

That is what the people of FUMC are: a Choir, not only in our singing voices but in the living out – the singing out – of our lives in the community called Farmingdale.

Tonight, I received an email from a friend that included a YouTube video of Amish employees working in a Lancaster County, Pennsylvania pretzel factory (Martin's Pretzels). Everybody (men and women) in this room was rolling out pretzel dough on huge tables— and singing praises to God with all of their hearts. They were singing "How Great Thou Art!" They work there and sing all day long.

Is that what you do where you live and work?

You may not work in an environment where you can sing out loud, but you *can* sing quietly, in your heart. You *can* pray in your heart. And your face and demeanor will radiate the joy of your life.

Will you come to church this month and sing out loud? Will come to church this month and bow your heads and pray quietly in your hearts? Will you come on Palm Sunday and hear our choir sing a special minicantata? Joining with us will be a number of visitors from our community and Farmingdale and Syosset High Schools. What a great blessing these "extra" singers are! Will you be there to share in the blessing with us? Please say that you will.

The Lord Jesus will be there, you know. This is all about Him, and it's all FOR Him, so He'll be there with a number of His angels to sing with us.

Please be there too to witness it all. We will altogether be singing "The Song of Redeeming Love." We do this every week at FUMC, but it will be especially true throughout the month of April.

Please bear with me, as I want to add one more thing for us to ponder upon, as we look toward the commemoration of the crucifixion and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This, by the way, makes tears collect at the backs of my eyeballs, when I read this. Know what I mean? So have some kleenex at hand when you read this:

MATTHEW 28:5-7 reads, "The angel spoke to the women: 'There is nothing to fear here. I know you're looking for Jesus, the One they nailed to the cross. He is not here. He was raised, just as He said. Come and look at the place where He was placed. Now get on your way quickly and tell His disciples, "He is risen from the dead. He is going on ahead of you to Galilee. You will see Him there." That's the message."

The text you just read above is from the BIBLE paraphrase I am reading through this year. It is called THE MESSAGE by Eugene H. Peterson. And what the angel said to the women at the tomb is "THE MESSAGE." In just a few words, that is exactly what the gospel of Jesus Christ has to say to us. It is "THE MESSAGE" that the angels gave to the women at the tomb: HE IS NOT HERE. YOUR GOD, YOUR SAVIOR-GOD, IS NOT DEAD. HE IS ALIVE. BELIEVE IT! HE CAME TO DIE AND RESURRECT FOR YOU! BELIEVE IT! OPEN YOUR HEART TO SING IT. LET IT BE THE SONG OF YOUR LIFE. IT IS THE SONG OF REDEEMING LOVE.

That message from the angels to the women at the tomb is our message too. Let us proclaim it and sing it EVERYWHERE!!!
