
Sunday Church Service 9:30AM

Notes From the Loft



LUKE 2:10-11 reads, "But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you. He is Christ the Lord."

Old Brother Luke rejoiced in bringing us this good news. It is also

interesting to read how Dr. Luke began his gospel account:

LUKE 1:1-4 reads, "Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. Therefore, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, it seemed good also to me to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught."

Thank God for our ancient Brothers in The Church, such as Dr. Luke, who believed that it was so absolutely vitally important to leave a carefully written record of the things that they themselves saw and understood from the Hebrew Scriptures about the coming of Christ Jesus into the world. He wrote these things, so that we might have "a certainty of the things we have been taught." Dr. Luke referred to himself and the others in his narrative as "eyewitnesses and servants of the word." The King James Version renders this phrase as, "eyewitnesses and ministers of the word."

In our day "old" Pastor Claire Wu preaches her heart out each week trying to make the gospel plain to us. And we on the music side of the ministry use hymns and "spiritual songs" to tell the story. We encourage you to pay close attention to the texts that we sing. We can learn a lot about our faith by considering and studying what so many hymn writers, such as Charles Wesley and Isaac Watts, penned. In fact, I recently read a comment from a religious writer who said that he wondered who had more influence on the Methodist movement – John Wesley in his sermons or Charles Wesley in his hymns? These two brothers certainly influenced and inspired each other.

In this month of December, 2024, we hope, as we tell "the same old Christmas story" that many of us have literally heard over and over all of our lives, that, maybe, this year we will listen and read and sing and perceive of this great, miraculous, historically mysterious story with fresh, new ears and minds. For example, when the choir sings on Sunday, December 1st, the anthem with the title, "Will We Know Him?" can we imagine what it might have been like in Herod's palace and among the Jewish rabbis and scholars or with the shepherds in the open fields among the flocks of sheep to receive this highly unusual report from the mouths of angels and from "wise men" from foreign countries? These people had a difficult time wrapping their minds around this supposed "good news" and "glad tidings of great joy which shall be to all people" that angels declared. And we must ask ourselves the question, "Is this still good news for me? Or do the traditions of this holy-day season seem to get a little 'old?' Does the miraculous story of Christ's birth REALLY cause me to rejoice with 'joy unspeakable?'"

On Sunday, December 1st, you will also hear a special, gorgeously melodic carol, "Some Children See Him." Oh, what a message this song sings! You'd better have some tissues at hand when you hear this one. It tells us that people from different cultures and races may imagine His physical appearance differently from place to place, but, "Ah, they love Him too."

Throughout the month of December Pastor Claire will choose old and new songs to sing in the worship service to help us experience "the old, old story" that is ever, ever new. As it was with our "old" Brother in Christ, Dr. Luke, Pastor Claire's desire is for us to "know the certainty of the things [we] have been taught" and to prepare us to be "servants of the word," as we minister to the world.

On Sunday, December 15th, we will experience the joy of the internationally proclaimed, "FUMC Children's



Christmas Pageant!" – complete with the attendance of royal personages, as well as common, unwashed shepherds, several wooly sheep, and, to complete the holy-day picture, a young, humble, lovely, loving couple with their newborn baby! Incredible! This highly trained, theatrical entourage will lead us in singing a number of our favorite Christmas carols. You must not miss this! It is truly a once-in-a-lifetime, culturally rich opportunity!

And – talk about "a once-in-a-lifetime, culturally rich opportunity" – WOW! – Don't miss hearing The Chancel Choir's "cantata" presentation on Sunday, December 22nd. The Choir loves to sing special musical treats like this, as the congregation is often invited to sing along in some of the carols that are always part of the cantata. This is such a blessing for the congregation of FUMC! The Lord Jesus, Himself, and a number of His personally selected, finest singing angels are invited to join with us in the singing, and they never fail to join with us. What an honor this is for the FUMC family! One more thing: The Christmas Eve 7:00 p.m. Family Service and 10:30 Candlelight Service always provide opportunities of family togetherness that live on in our memories for generations. Come to Church on Christmas Eve in order to hear Pastor Claire's inspired preaching, as well as to join with other Christians in singing holiday songs we have loved singing all of our lives.

How good it is to go with the family each week to church, and this is especially true in the month of December.


