

in fire safety.





Notes From the Loft



PSALMS 7:17 reads: "I will sing praises of the name of the LORD most high."

It is true. I love to sing the name of my Lord Jesus Christ.

Hymn #170 begins, "There is a name I love to hear. I love to sing its worth. It

sounds like music in my ear. The sweetest name on earth! Oh, how I love Jesus! ... Because He first loved me!"

Then there's hymn #171, which begins, "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus! There's just something about that name! ... Kings and kingdoms will all pass away, but there's something about that name!"

And how about #174, which begins, "His name is wonderful... Jesus, my Lord!"

Martin Luther had an interesting perspective on music. Listen to what he said:

I wish to see all arts, principally music, in the service of Him who gave and created them. Music is a fair and glorious gift of God. I would not for the world forego my humble share of music. Singers are never sorrowful, but are merry, and smile through their troubles in song. Music makes people kinder, gentler, more staid and reasonable. I am strongly persuaded that after theology there is no art that can be placed on a level with music; for besides theology, music is the only art capable of affording peace and joy of the heart ... the devil flees before the sound of music almost as much as before the Word of God.

When I read Luther's line, "Singers are never sorrowful, but are merry, and smile through their troubles in song,"

I, of course, thought *immediately* of our church choir. Oh, what a jolly group they are! And their singing never fails to brighten me. Many people from the congregation have told me the same thing. My response to them is this: "Before the choir sings, we always ask God's blessing on our efforts. We ask our Savior-God to sing with us, and we ask Him to send some angels to join with us too." Our Lord Jesus never fails to respect our humble request. We are quite lost and empty without Him, you know. And He *does* love to sing with us.

By the way, ... you are invited to sing with our choir too. We will soon begin rehearsing music for Christmas. Wouldn't you just *love* to sing with us at Christmas time, especially. Just show up in the South Transept on Thursday evenings at 7:30 p.m. I am not nearly as nasty and mean and grumpy as the choir says I am. I mean, ... I have my bad days, just like anyone else. But then, ... the choir begins to sing, and I am automatically catapulted to somewhere close to heaven.

Please come and join us on Thursday evenings.

And DEFINITELY sing with the Pastor (who has a gorgeous voice herself) and the choir and the entire congregation on Sunday mornings. Jesus will save a spot right next to Him. He'll help you. Yeah, ... there's a voice I *love* to hear!
