
Sunday Church Service 9:30AM

Skip Newman Scholarship

For those of you who did not have the pleasure of knowing Skip Newman, he was a beloved member of our church who died at the young age of 52 in March, 1994. At the time of his untimely death, Skip bequeathed to Farmingdale United Methodist Church a legacy of unmatched godly commitment to its membership, its youth, and all others whom he could inspire. He was a teacher to many, a tireless mentor to the young, a counselor to people in distress, and a friend to all those who were in search of the Christian way. Skip displayed his love of God through his love for people and greeted everyone with warmth and a great smile. After military service as a "green beret", Skip returned to his roots and for many years volunteered his services as a line fireman at Farmingdale's Main St. fire station. It has been in recognition and remembrance of the love and work of this deeply religious man that the youth of this church have been celebrated through a scholarship fund established by his wife Charlene Newman.

At the time that this scholarship was created, no instructions were provided as to how it should be

administered. It evolved over time and went through many changes in how the scholarship should be awarded, the requirements for application and the dollar amounts of the rewards. The scholarship committee put a great deal of thought into these decisions each year.

The first year that a scholarship was awarded was in 1995 to Amy Suwalski. Over its 30-year history sixty-two (62) of our youth have been awarded scholarships totaling \$55,000. It is not clear the amount that Charlene first gave in 1994 but in 1997 the fund held just \$10,000 – a combination of her bequest and donations made in Skip's memory. The fund was invested in various CDs for many years and eventually moved to the United Methodist Frontier Foundation where it continued to grow.

The scholarship has now run its course. With the award to Zach Smith in 2024, it has gone from A to Z with Amy to Zach! This will be the last year that it is offered but we will never forget Skip and will continue to celebrate his legacy.


